## Federal Environmental Screening Report Available for Public Comment

*This is the fourth in a series of newsletters intended to keep individuals and communities informed of KSL Project developments.*

The KSL Project is currently undergoing an Environmental Assessment under the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act*. As part of this process, a Screening Report has been prepared by the Responsible Authorities, which identifies the potential environmental effects of the proposed Project and the mitigation measures necessary to adequately address potential adverse effects of the Project on the environment.

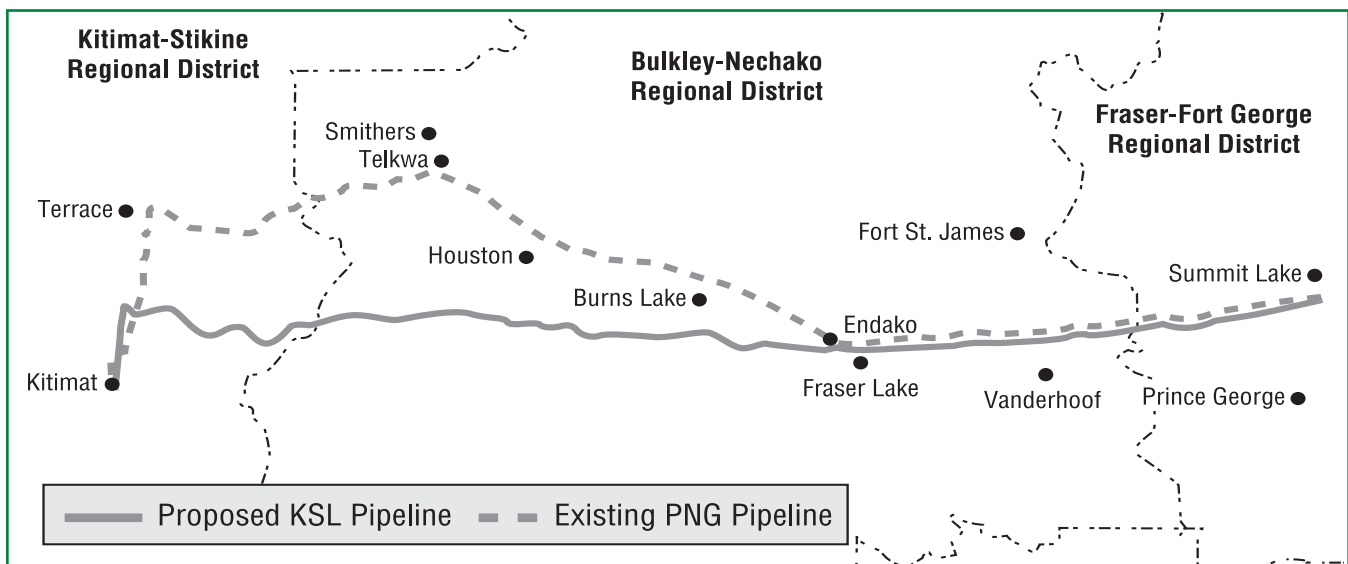
Fisheries and Oceans Canada and Transport Canada – the Responsible Authorities – are inviting the public to comment on the conclusions, recommendations and any other aspect of the screening report prepared for the proposed Kitimat-Summit Lake (KSL) Natural Gas Pipeline Looping Project.

### KSL Project to Serve Export Terminal

Pacific Trail Pipelines is developing the natural gas transmission pipeline system from Summit Lake to Kitimat, British Columbia to serve Kitimat LNG Inc.'s (KLNG) terminal near Kitimat, B.C. On September 19, 2008, KLNG announced the terminal project – originally designed to be an import terminal – had been revised to be an export terminal.

The KSL Project – a bi-directional pipeline – originally proposed to deliver natural gas to the Spectra Energy Transmission (SET) pipeline system at Summit Lake will now deliver gas from SET to the Kitimat terminal. The KSL Project will provide excellent access to Western Canada's expanding natural gas supplies.



## **KSL Project Receives Provincial Approval**

On June 27, 2008, provincial Environment Minister Barry Penner and Energy, Mines and Petroleum Resources Minister Richard Neufeld granted an Environmental Assessment Certificate to the KSL Project after considering a comprehensive review led by B.C.'s Environmental Assessment Office. The certificate includes numerous commitments to be met by Pacific Trail Pipelines to protect the environment.
